Students who complete an A.F.A. in Music at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute are exempt from lower-division General Education requirements at UNC Charlotte, including courses in composition, mathematics and logic, sciences, social sciences, and liberal studies, as well as three credits designated as writing intensive and one to three credits designated as oral communications. Students must still complete a “Writing in the Discipline” (W) course at UNC Charlotte and must demonstrate proficiency in the language of their choice through the 1202 level. Proficiency can be demonstrated in the following ways: (1) completing the required coursework at UNC Charlotte; (2) completing three years of the same foreign language in high school through level three; (3) achieving a satisfactory score on the foreign languages placement test (in Spanish, French or German); (4) through approved transfer or transient credit earned at other accredited institutions, including Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute; (5) a combination of the above methods (e.g., placing out of or earning transfer or transient credit for 1201 and completing the 1202 course, completing 1201 and placing out of or earning transfer or transient credit for 1202).

Students must complete the A.F.A. in Music at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute in order to participate in the transfer agreement and may transfer a maximum of sixty-four (64) semester credit hours from Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute.

Students who complete an A.F.A. in Music at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute are exempt from several Musicianship Courses at UNC Charlotte, including Introduction to Music Studies; two semesters of Music Theory and Ear Training; and two semesters of Class Piano.

Students who complete MUS 221 and MUS 222 at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute are exempt from the third and fourth semesters of Music Theory and Ear Training at UNC Charlotte. Students who complete MUS 251P and MUS 252P at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute are exempt from the third and fourth semesters of Class Piano at UNC Charlotte. Students who complete MUS 170 at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute are exempt from MUSC 2101 at UNC Charlotte.

(1) Bachelor of Music – Concentration in Composition UNC Charlotte Courses (Can be completed in 2-3 years)

In addition to applying to the university, all students who wish to major in music must complete an entrance audition. See the “Future Students” link at www.music.uncc.edu for more information. Students who complete an A.F.A. in Music at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute should follow the Repertoire Guidelines for Students Auditioning for Upper-Division Study (Junior/Senior Level). Students who wish to pursue the concentration in Composition must also submit a portfolio of no fewer than three original compositions. UNC Charlotte accepts a maximum of 64 semester hours of credit from two-year institutions and requires a minimum of 120 credit hours (including transfer hours) for graduation.

A student with an A.F.A. in Music from Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute may take 2 to 3 years to complete a B.M. in Music with a concentration in Composition, depending on how much Music Theory the student has taken at the community college. Students who do not take the third and fourth semesters at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute will need to enroll in sophomore-level courses at UNC Charlotte before progressing to upper-division music courses, particularly those in music theory and composition. Students who complete MUS 221 and MUS 222 at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute are exempt from the third and fourth semesters of Music Theory and Ear Training at UNC Charlotte, can enter directly into upper-division coursework, and may be able to complete the program in two years.

Any music courses at the 1000 or 2000 level, including Class Piano III and IV, can be taken concurrently with lower- or upper-division coursework.

Graduate with Bachelor of Music - Concentration in Composition

1. Required courses in music and performance must be passed with a grade of “C” or better.
2. All music majors must enroll in Applied Music, a Primary Ensemble, and Performance Class every fall and spring semester they are enrolled in school. Composition students are also required to enroll in at least two Secondary Ensembles prior to graduation.
3. Students enrolled in MUPF 1253 or MUPF 3256 (Applied Music: Voice) may be required to take MUSC 2137 (Phonetics and Articulation for Singers I), MUSC 2138 (Phonetics and Articulation for Singers II), MUSC 2237 (Phonetics and Articulation for Singers III), and MUSC 2238 (Phonetics and Articulation for Singers IV).

UNC Charlotte accepts a maximum of 64 semester hours of credit from two-year institutions and requires a minimum of 120 credit hours (including transfer hours) for graduation.

A student with an A.F.A. in Music from Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute may take 2 to 3 years to complete a B.M. in Music with a concentration in Jazz Studies, depending on how much Music Theory the student has taken at the community college as well as on the time it will take each individual student to prepare for and complete the junior and senior recitals. Depending on the results of the entrance audition, a student may be exempt from one or two semesters of Primary Ensembles (MUPF 11XX), one or two semesters of lower-division Applied Music (MUPF 12XX), and one or two semesters of lower-division Performance Class (MUSC 1300). Students who are exempted from two semesters of Primary Ensembles and lower-division Applied Music / Performance Class can enter directly into upper-division coursework and may be able to complete the program in two years. Any music courses at the 1000 or 2000 level, including Class Piano III and IV, can be taken concurrently with lower- or upper-division coursework.

Students who complete an A.F.A. in Music at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute should follow the Repertoire Guidelines for Students Auditioning for Upper-Division Study (Junior/Senior Level). UNC Charlotte accepts a maximum of 64 semester hours of credit from two-year institutions and requires a minimum of 120 credit hours (including transfer hours) for graduation.

A student with an A.F.A. in Music from Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute may take 2 to 3 years to complete a B.M. in Music with a concentration in Instrumental Performance, depending on how much Music Theory the student has taken at the community college as well as on the time it will take each individual student to prepare for and complete the junior and senior recitals. Depending on the results of the entrance audition, a student may be exempt from one or two semesters of Primary Ensembles and Secondary Ensembles (MUPF 11XX), one or two semesters of lower-division Applied Music (MUPF 12XX), and one or two semesters of lower-division Performance Class (MUSC 1300). Students who are exempted from two semesters of Primary / Secondary Ensembles and lower-division Applied Music / Performance Class can enter directly into upper-division coursework and may be able to complete the program in two years.

Any music courses at the 1000 or 2000 level, including Class Piano III and IV, can be taken concurrently with lower- or upper-division coursework.
