Students who complete an A.F.A. in Music at Sandhills Community College are exempt from lower-division General Education requirements at UNC Charlotte, including courses in composition, mathematics and logic, sciences, social sciences, and liberal studies, as well as three credits designated as writing intensive and one to three credits designated as oral communications. All courses must be passed with a grade of “C” or better. Students must still complete a “Writing in the Discipline” (W) course at UNC Charlotte and must demonstrate proficiency in the language of their choice through the 1202 level. Proficiency can be demonstrated in the following ways: (1) completing the required coursework at UNC Charlotte; (2) completing three years of the same foreign language in high school through level three; (3) achieving a satisfactory score on the foreign languages placement test (in Spanish, French or German); (4) through approved transfer or transient credit earned at other accredited institutions, including Sandhills Community College; (5) a combination of the above methods (e.g., placing out of or earning transfer or transient credit for 1201 and completing the 1202 course, completing 1201 and placing out of or earning transfer or transient credit for 1202).

Students must complete the A.F.A. in Music at Sandhills Community College in order to participate in the transfer agreement and may transfer a maximum of sixty-four (64) semester credit hours from Sandhills Community College. Students who complete an A.F.A. in Music at Sandhills Community College are exempt from several Musicianship Courses at UNC Charlotte, including four semesters of Music Theory and Ear Training; two semesters of Class Piano; and two semesters of Music History.

2. All music majors must enroll in Applied Music, a Primary Ensemble, and Performance Class every fall and spring semester they are enrolled in school. Composition students are also required to enroll in at least two Secondary Ensembles prior to graduation.

Students enrolled in MUPF 1253 or MUPF 3256 (Applied Music: Voice) may be required to take MUSC 2137 (Phonetics and Articulation for Singers I), MUSC 2138 (Phonetics and Articulation for Singers II), MUSC 2237 (Phonetics and Articulation for Singers III), and MUSC 2238 (Phonetics and Articulation for Singers IV). A student with an A.F.A. in Music from Sandhills Community College may take 2 to 3 years to complete a B.M. in Music with a concentration in Jazz Studies, depending on the time it will take each individual student to prepare for and complete the junior and senior recitals. Depending on the results of the entrance audition, a student may be exempt from one or two semesters of Primary Ensembles (MUPF 11XX), one or two semesters of lower-division Applied Music (MUPF 12XX), and one or two semesters of lower-division Performance Class (MUSC 1300). Students who are exempted from two semesters of Primary Ensembles and lower-division Applied Music / Performance Class can enter directly into upper-division coursework and may be able to complete the program in two years. Any music courses at the 1000 or 2000 level, including Class Piano III and IV, can be taken concurrently with lower- or upper-division coursework.

In addition to applying to the university, all students who wish to major in music must complete an entrance audition. See the “Admissions” link at www.music.unc.edu for more information. Students who complete an A.F.A. in Music at Sandhills Community College should follow the Repertoire Guidelines for Students Auditioning for Upper-Division Study (Junior/Senior Level). UNC Charlotte accepts a maximum of 64 semester hours of credit from two-year institutions and requires a minimum of 120 credit hours (including transfer hours) for graduation.

A student with an A.F.A. in Music from Sandhills Community College may take 2 to 3 years to complete a B.M. in Music with a concentration in Vocal Performance, depending on the time it will take each individual student to prepare for and complete the junior and senior recitals. Depending on the results of the entrance audition, a student may be exempt from one or two semesters of Primary Ensembles and Secondary Ensembles (MUPF 11XX), one or two semesters of lower-division Applied Music (MUPF 12XX), and one or two semesters of lower-division Performance Class (MUSC 1300). Students who are exempted from two semesters of Primary / Secondary Ensembles and lower-division Applied Music / Performance Class can enter directly into upper-division coursework and may be able to complete the program in two years. Any music courses at the 1000 or 2000 level, including Phonetics and Articulation I and II and Class Piano III and IV, can be taken concurrently with lower- or upper-division coursework.
